



ACREAGE: 25.6 | YEAR ACQUIRED: 1994

Originally part of the 13,000-acre Limberlost Swamp and forest made famous by naturalist and author Gene Stratton-Porter, this preserve is the site of Brushwood School House, mentioned in Stratton-Porter's *Girl of the Limberlost*. On this property, visitors can look for and find the birds, trees and wildflowers described in Stratton-Porter's books.



DIRECTIONS:

From Geneva take SR 116 west 2.75 miles to 400 W and turn left (south). Travel 0.5 miles to the preserve on the left, at the corner of 1100 S.
